the drug(s) that he or she is responsible for administering and monitoring Assessment is ongoing throughout the entire nursing process, as patients’ conditions may change Nurses must continually monitor drug effects, both therapeutic and unintended A complete medication history and nursing physical assessment are part of the assessment step

### **National Action Plan for Adverse Drug Event Prevention**

prevention of adverse drug events among three primary drug classes: anticoagulants, diabetes agents, and opioids The ADE Action Plan is intended to encourage nationwide efforts to coordinate Federal resources and activities that will reduce preventable adverse drug events and increase awareness of the importance of medication safety

**Hypertensive Management for African American Patients**

the increase of adverse drug side effects Not only was an increased risk for angioedema apparent with African Americans but also East Asians developed cough and hyperkalemia (Morimoto et al, 2003) This study went a step beyond angioedema and explored the other comorbidities associated with ACE-I use which further proved ethnic
