educational achievement, and continues to do so into adolescence and adulthood<sup>1</sup> The quality and content of fathers' involvement matter more for children's ...

### **Including Parents in Evaluation of a Child Development ...**

Goldring and Shapira (1993) found that parents of first- through eighth-graders who are more involved in their children's school are also more satisfied with it In another study, Fantuzzo et al (2006) found that parents of younger children were more satisfied with their child's school than were parents ...

Parents were silent about the monitoring and supervision of their children's work while they are at home, which can result in better academic performance Parents should have high expectations for their children's future and academic achievement It emerged from the interviews that many factors present barriers to parental
