Building English Language Learners’ Academic Vocabulary

Three Tier Model places vocabulary words into three categories: Tier 1 which consists of basic or common words, Tier 2 which involves words that are used across the curriculum and multiple meaning words, and Tier 3 which is content specific vocabulary In this model (see Figure 1),

clear with respect to effective teaching of words (Graves, 2006) Vocabulary instruction should (1) provide students with information that contains the context as well as the meaning of the word, (2) design instruction that engages students and allows sufficient time for word learning, (3) make sure students have multiple exposures to the words

Effective strategies for teaching science vocabulary

science vocabulary words and asking them to write the words, find the definitions in a dictionary or the glossary of the textbook, match the words to definitions, or use the words in a sentence In this model of instruction, words are often presented in isolation and students are tested on the words alone, without application to concepts

Vocabulary Demands on Students are Daunting • 450,000 words in English- largest vocabulary of languages in use today • Students must learn 3,000 words per year by 3rd grade • Only 400 words a year are directly taught by teachers • Academic demands are high • However, everyday speech consists of only 5,000- 7,000 words
