Research demonstrates that children who are frequent viewers of violence on television are less likely to show empathy toward the pain and suffering of others and more likely to behave aggressively

The information provided by television is obtained first and foremost through news programmes All of the viewer categories in almost all of the Member States watch the television news Indeed for some individuals, who do not read the press and do not listen to radio news, television is the only source of regular information on current affairs
