Wound Care: The Basics

Fluid from wound • Document the amount, type and odor • Light, moderate, heavy • Drainage can be clear, sanguineous (bloody), serosanguineous (blood-tinged), purulent (cloudy, pus-yellow, green) Odor Most wounds have an odor Be sure to clean wound well first before assessing odor (wound ...
